

- To what extent do students believe the project will make a meaningful difference?

Are students not as excited about the project idea as you'd hoped? Teachers may choose to adapt the initial project idea to ensure meaningful student engagement.

Teachers guide students to complete preparations and carry out their "Take Action" project activities.



Teachers and students celebrate their projects with the school community, and/or with parents and community members. Insights from the project can be shared to inspire others and express gratitude to all who participated. We encourage teachers to share completed projects (with permission) on the school and/or school board's social media and tag @learnquebec. Local media also loves a positive story!

Schools with Community Development Agents can ask them to help plan the event.



Students' reflect on their experiences to provide feedback on what they learned during the project, the difference they feel they made, and how they will continue to motivate themselves in their bilingualism/biliteracy.



Teacher reflections are just as important! The LEARN team will ask teachers to share project artifacts and their insights by completing a brief survey.
