What is the Daily 5?

A literacy structure and classroom management system that teaches students to be independent learners.

What is the Research?

- •John Medina 10 minute rule, brain breaks
- •Regie Routman 80/20, no more spray and pray, practice makes perfect
- •Student Choice powerful force that allows students to take ownership of their learning
- •Sufficient time to read and write —you can listen without thinking but you cannot write without thinking

Characteristics of the Daily 5

- 1. Independent Literacy Blocks
- •Read to Self
- Work on Writing
- Read to Someone
- Listen to Reading
- Word Work
- Teacher works with small groups or individuals
- 2. Set up a purpose and Create a Sense of Urgency

- 3. Sufficient Time To Read and Write
- 4. Focus Lessons (Strategies)
- 5. The 10 Steps to Independence
- 6. Foundation Lessons

The 10 Steps to Teaching and Learning Independence

- **Step 1.** Identify What Is to Be Taught
- **Step 2.** Set a Purpose and Create a Sense of Urgency
- **Step 3.** Record Desired Behaviours on an I-Chart
- **Step 4.** Model Most-Desirable Behaviours
- **Step 5.** Model Least-Desirable Behaviours, Then Most-Desirable Behaviours Again
- **Step 6.** Place Students Around the Room
- **Step 7.** Practice and Build Stamina
- Step 8. Stay Out of the Way
- **Step 9.** Use a Quiet Signal to Bring Students Back to the Gathering Place
- **Step 10.** Conduct a Group Check-In (ask, "How did it go?")
